Discussion and possible approval of CIS supporting Council File 20-0002-S145, Reproductive Rights / Forced Hysterectomies Prohibition / Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Facilities / Human Rights Violation: Introduced on September 29, 2020, and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. Resolutions is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2019-2020 Federal Legislative Program SUPPORT for any administrative or legislative action which would prohibit forced hysterectomies at ICE detention facilities.
- 16. Discussion and possible approval of CIS on Council File 20-1184, **New Hotel Uses / Impact / Density Bonus / Transit Oriented Communities (TOC) / Affordable Housing**: Introduced on September 16, 2020 and referred to Planning and Land Use Management Committee. Motion is instructing the Department of City Planning and the CLA to report back on whether new hotel uses in conjunction with incentives based on residential use have the potential to negatively impact the overall goals of housing promoting incentive programs and policies such as the Density Bonus and TOC programs and consider whether hotel uses should be prohibited.
