Key Ring @ 64 $\,$ ¢ each = \$663, 1000 Custom 3-Step Lids (for various sizes of cans) @ 55 $\,$ ¢ each = \$551, 1000 Quilted Pot Holders @\$2.54 each (item Q49862) = \$2540 – up to 500 each (item Q37865) @ \$4.71 each = \$2,355 or 1000 (same type) @ \$4.56 each = \$4,560, Custom Reusable Tote Bags 1000 each (item Q22089) @1.46 each = \$1,460, or 1000 each (Q50515) @\$1.94 each = \$1,940. Various combinations would cost from \$3,659 - \$7,714. TBD by Board.
