



NORTH HILLS WEST NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL Regular Board Meeting Minutes, Thursday, June 16, 2022 Minutes Approved 7/21/2022

In conformity with the Governor's Executive Order N-29-20 (March 17, 2020) and due to concerns over COVID-19, this duly noticed meeting was held entirely online and telephonically.

- Welcome, Call Meeting to Order and Pledge of Allegiance.
 President Madlena Minasian called the Meeting to order at 7:24 p.m. Later, the Pledge of Allegiance was said.
- 2. Roll Call, Determination of Quorum, and Voting Eligibility Report.
 Roll Call was taken by the Secretary. Ten of the 11 Board Members were present online at the Roll Call: Dave Brown (Secretary), Angel Collins, Pat Crone (Treasurer), Maggie Elliott, Linda Erdman, Garry Fordyce, Punam Gohel, Carol Hart (Vice-President), David Hyman and Madlena Minasian (President). Kreshell Ramey arrived later. The NHWNC quorum (the minimum number of Board Members needing to be present to take binding votes on Agendized Items) was seven (see the Bylaws link at www.empowerla.org/nhwnc), so the Board could take such votes. Quorum was announced. Mr. Brown confirmed that all Board Members' trainings were compliant and they were eligible to vote. Eleven of the 13 Board Seats were filled (by election or appointment). Two Board Seats were vacant (General, and Residential); to apply, email Secretary@nhwnc.net. Also attended: at least 25 Stakeholders and quests.
- 3. <u>Announcements and Opening Comments</u> Madlena Minasian, President. Ms. Minasian requested and a moment of silence was held in honor of law enforcement officers who recently passed away. She reminded that the NHWNC is here "to serve the needs of the community." She noted meeting procedures.
- 4. <u>Discussion and possible action</u> to approve May 19, 2022 General Board Meeting Draft Minutes

Board Members Punam Gohel were unavailable to vote at and Kreshell Ramey arrived by this time (7:34), making 10 Board Members present online (the NHWNC quorum was seven).

MOTION (by Ms. Minasian, seconded by Ms. Hart): The North Hills West Neighborhood Council approves the Minutes of its May 19, 2022 Regular Board Meeting as written.

MOTION PASSED by a roll call vote of the 10 eligible voters present with nine in favor ("Yes" or "Aye") (Brown, Collins, Crone, Elliott, Erdman, Hart, Hyman, Minasian and Ramey); one opposed ("No" or "Nay") (Fordyce); zero abstained.

5. Review, discussion and possible approval of received Board member application(s).

Ms. Minasian requested that applications be forwarded to her.

6. General Public Comment

Resident Jeff Bankston reported that his truck was broken into again and other vehicles have been broken into. Resident Debra Francisco reported that a 1914 home was approved to be a Cultural Historical Monument.

7. Public Agency Speakers and Announcements.

A. Elected Officials' and Field Representatives.

Lilly Sarafian, a Field Representative for State 46th District Assemblymember Adrin Nazarian (818-376-4246; Lilly.Sarafian@asm.ca.gov; http://asmdc.org/members/a46), introduced herself and offered help on State-related matters. Mr. Hyman reported that North Hills West will, in December, due to redistricting be moved to the 40th State Assembly District.

B. City Agencies including the City of Los Angeles' Department of Neighborhood Empowerment Report.

Efren Corral, an LAPD Devonshire Division (east of CSUN) Senior Lead Officer [Desk: (818) 832-0746; Cell: 424-339-4079; 35472@LAPD.Online; http://www.LAPDonline.org/devonshire_community_police_station], urged to "be mindful of your surroundings . . . be a good witness . . . in every single category, crime is up." He encouraged addressing infrastructure requests to the appropriate City Department and also him so he "knows what's going on."

Matt Hernandez, Public Safety Deputy for L.A. City District 12 Councilmember John Lee [818-882-1212; Matthew.Hernandez@LACity.org; www.CD12.org], reported that on enforcement against illegal businesses near sensitive uses such as schools. National Night Out will be August 2nd.

John Darnell, a Neighborhood Empowerment Advocate of the L.A. Dept. of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE) [213-978-1551; John.Darnell@LACity.org; www.EmpowerLA.org], reported that, in July, Neighborhood Councils will continue to only have virtual meetings. The Congress of Neighborhood Councils [NCCongress@EmpowerLA.org and NeighborhoodCongress.LA] will be online Saturday, September 24th.

An LA School Police Department representative described safety work and issues.

C. LAPD Mission Division, Community Police Advisory Board, Quality of Life Committee Update regarding illegal fireworks mitigation, including 2nd Annual Fireworks Buyback and July 4th Drone Light Show & Festival at Hansen Dam, 5-9pm at Hansen Dam soccer fields, Lakeview Terrace. Street light copper wire theft update \$12.84M of 2022-23 Budget allocated to combat theft and repair and upgrade street lighting. Gohel / Brown.

Mr. Brown explained this. Anyone can report illegal fireworks sale, use or possession to NolllegalFireworks@gmail.com. He encouraged reporting people impersonating City workers and stealing street light and other wiring.

8. <u>Guest Speakers, Public Service Announcements, Liaisons & Informational Presentations.</u>

A. Ben Steinberger, Public Affairs Advisor, SoCalGas regarding a CPUC mandated Pipeline Safety Enhancement project at Woodley Ave & Woodley Place beginning April 2023 for 4 to 6 months. Hart.

Mr. Steinberger, a SoCalGas Public Affairs Manager, showed slides and presented. The Valve Relocation Project will be near the intersection of Woodley Ave. and Woodley Pl. and is "part of a safety improvement plan mandated by the CPUC . . . [that] will take about four to six months." Engineer Sepehr Raja showed slides and gave project details. It will start April 23rd on Mondays-Fridays from 9:00 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. "Notifications will be sent" regarding working hours, traffic diversions and more. Mr. Hyman requested that SoCalGas work with the City to coordinate this project with repaving the very rough Woodley Pl. Mr. Steinberger agreed to send notices to all residences within 1,000 feet of the project, not only 500 feet.

B. Budget Advocates - Glenn Bailey and/or NHWNC Budget Representative. Crone.

Mr. Bailey, a Budget Advocate [LABudgetAdvocates@gmail.com; www.BudgetAdvocates.org], reported on the upcoming Congress and urged early registration.

C. The Official Nonprofit of the Year award in Sacramento - goes this year to VCC, Volunteers Cleaning Communities, our recent Neighborhood Council NPG awardee. Hart

FUNDING MOTION PASSED by a roll call vote of the nine eligible voters present with eight in favor ("Yes" or "Aye") (Brown, Crone, Elliott, Erdman, Hart, Hyman, Minasian and Ramey); one opposed ("No" or "Nay") (Fordyce); zero abstained. One was ineligible (Ramey) to vote due to not having completed one or more of the required trainings and/or not having signed the Code of Conduct.

FUNDING MOTION PASSED by a roll call vote of the nine eligible voters present with eight in favor ("Yes" or "Aye") (Brown, Crone, Elliott, Erdman, Hart, Hyman, Minasian and Ramey); one opposed ("No" or "Nay") (Fordyce); zero abstained.
