## Steps to plant a tree in your parkway.

Identity address

CTW's requires Commitment to water for 3 years.

Person at the address in front of the possible tree planting must give permission (CTW-Commitment to Water) and that person or another party has to promise to water for three year. A neighborhood or a BID or similar group can take the responsibility for water if need be.

Request trees through 311 system.

The city will assign a partnering non-profit to inspect the site and validate the site condition and infrastructure and that it meets the City requirements for tree planting. If approved the non-profit will apply for a permit to the City to plant the tree.

The Urban Forestry Dept will send out their inspector to validate the location. If the location meets City's standard, a permit is then issued.

The City inspector selects the tree species, usually based on the environment in the neighborhood. Constituents can have input in the tree species selection. The City inspector makes the final decision.

This process can take up to 4 months.

The non-profit will come back with the planting.

The non-profit will contact the constituent if they would like to participate in the planting.

If a concrete cut is required, that entails a separate permitting process. City Plants program supplies the tree and the labor for tree planting but does not generally have funding for concrete cutting and removal.

Different organization like a Neighborhood Watch, Neighborhood Council, BID, etc. can organize neighborhood plantings. They should begin by identifying places to plant and empty tree wells. There must be a CTW for every location. The organization can sign the CTW for the various addresses which means they will have to water these addresses for 3 years.

The merchant or resident at the designated location has the right to refuse the tree and must be notified in advance of the permitting process.

A neighborhood organize can collect CTW's, submit them to the City, work with the non-profit planting partner and create a neighborhood event so that community members can come out and plant.

The coordinating organization can pay a qualified third party to do the tree care and watering.

Through the LA DWP and City Plant programs, private property "free yard trees" program offer up to 7, 5-gallon trees to shade your property. You can also request a "Tree Giveaway" event in your neighborhood hosted by one of the planting partners. You preorder online and the host then sets up a curbside distribution in your neighborhood.

4) Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant.

When our communities needed us most, North Valley Caring Services answered the call from of Los Angeles City officials and we ramped up our Food distribution programs 1,000% from serving 400 families a week to over 4,000 families a week. As an entrusted organization of San Fernando Valley, NVCS was able to rally a substantial Volunteer force who from day one of the "Stay at Home Order" came together and became essential in our ability to provide food for those in need. We did not simply focus our efforts on "our neighborhood" but we chose instead to support all cities and neighborhoods in SFV. Because we had forklifts, pallet jacks and a large gymnasium, we were able to move over 5 million pounds of food during the pandemic. We have assisted other groups and organizations by receiving pallets from 50 foot trailers and loading them on to smaller trucks that provide food in their own communities. This all done free of charge, incurring expenses and wearing down our equipment. Now is the time that NVCS is asking stakeholders to 🛁 support NVCS so that we can continue this work throughout the rest of these pandemic as well as difficult times that may arise in the future.

#### SECTION II - PROJECT DESCRIPTION

4) Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant.

The purpose of the grant is to cover the cost of our Community Improvement and Beautification Project in the North Hills community. The grant would go to the costs of weed-containing ground cover to surround and protect the row of newly planted, flowering trees along the entire public street which has a public sidewalk. The walking areas along the northeast corner of Parthenia Street and Haskell Avenue serve as our property parameters and have a substantial presence along the city block. Additionally, the grant would cover costs

for a part-time worker with a disability to perform the duties of keeping these public areas properly irrigated, clean and safe from random trash, debris, and unwanted graffiti, as well as monitoring the ground coverings, manicured growth, and any signs of needed repairs.

5) How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at-large. (Grants cannot be used as rewards or prizes for individuals)

New Horizons is preparing for re-entry onto our campus for our program members, staff, and the public community.
