- 11. Budget Expenditure Recommendation for Additional Outreach Materials** – Discussion and possible motion to set aside up to \$1000 for the purchase of promotional outreach items. - C. Motion: NHWNC will issue a CIS - opposing unless amended - the expansion of Fire District 1.

NOTE: The Neighborhood Council Sustainability Alliance voted unanimously to oppose expansion.

Some feel that this would be a boon to developers opening the door to the use of more climate-damaging concrete and steel construction used in the building of higher density structures in what are currently low-density residential neighborhoods. Fire and Safety Codes are already in place to ensure public safety. The study is already complete.
